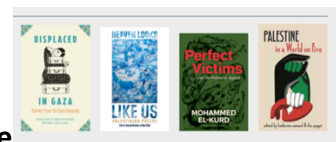
- *One Day Everyone will have been Against This* by Omar El Akkad – Award winning novelist and journalist “chronicles the fracture that has occurred for Black, brown, Indigenous Americans...who clung to a thread of faith that their countries ... attempted to live up to the values they espouse
- *Something about Living* by Lena Khalaf Tuffaha – Winner of the 2024 National Book Award for poetry. “This collection is her witness to our collective unraveling, vowel by vowel, syllable by syllable.”
- *One Hundred Year War on Palestine* by Rashid Khalidi – History of the colonial war on Palestine, beginning with the 1917 Balfour Declaration.
- *Palestine Speaks* – oral histories from Gaza and the West Bank, including from a fisherman, a settlement administrator, and a marathon runner, a journalist and the founder of a solidarity movement.
- *Tomorrow is Yesterday* by Agha Hussein and Robert Malley – participants in the Oslo Peace Accords analyse its historic failure.
- *Palestine: Peace not Apartheid* by Jimmy Carter – controversial 2006 account by the former President which he has defended as “a word that's a very accurate description of the forced separation within the West Bank of Israelis from Palestinians and the total domination and oppression of Palestinians by the dominant Israeli military.”
- *Can we Talk about Israel* by Daniel Sokatch – the head of the New Israel Fund writes an illustrated guide for “the curious, confused and conflicted.”
- *The Politics of Dispossession* by Edward Said – 1994 work by the preeminent Palestinian historian and intellectual and founder of post-colonial studies.

- Ilan Pappé – the preeminent Israeli scholar and leading figure among Israel’s New Historians (A History of Modern Palestine, The Forgotten Palestinians, The Ethnic Cleansing of Palestine)
- Edward Said – former Columbia professor and leading Palestinian intellectual whose work explores post-colonialism and dispossession (Power, politics and Culture, Out of Place, Reflections on Exile, Orientalism, The Question of Palestine)
- Eyal Weizman – Founder of Forensic Architecture at Goldsmith and genocide scholar. (The Least of all Possible Evils, Extraterritorialities in Occupied Worlds)
- *Palestine* by Joe Sacco – the conflict as a graphic novel
- *Stories from Palestine* - Profiles of Palestinians engaged in creative and productive pursuits in the West Bank, Jerusalem, and the Gaza Strip.
- *Camera Palestina* - Photography and Displaced Histories of Palestine
- *Invited to Witness* by Jennifer Lynn Kelly - explores the political strategy and emergent industry of contemporary solidarity tourism in Palestine/Israel.
- *Unsettled* edited by Oren Kroll Zeldin – examining the role of American Jews in the Palestine solidarity movement
